BLOOD SUPPLIES

You will have seen Mark Ferrero's note of 11th August. I have failed in my attempt
to persuade Ministers that we should make some greater attempt to find if there
are alternative sources of blood before referring the issue back to SEAC and
MSBT. However, I think I have persuaded them that both these committees
need to be consulted.

- 2. I have certainly persuaded Mark that if SEAC are to receive a paper it must deal not only with the question of safety of supply but also the demand for blood from surgeons, anaesthetists, physicians and so on. We cannot run the risk that SEAC will come up with an answer which disregards the patient's needs for blood transfusion to save life or preserve health. I think that point at least is established.
- 3. Clearly it would be sensible for SEAC's discussion on blood to co-opt one or two experts who can talk about the reasons why it is essential that the blood supply is maintained.
