Subject: TMER 476: latest vCJD notification

Dear Kate and Rowena

This is an early warning about a new case of possible vCJD in an individual who is known to have donated blood in Wales and England.

According to the current procedures, vCJD cases are only notified to Blood Services when probable or confirmed. This case was known to be a donor and was in fact notified to us by the local clinicia ns before NCJDSU had seen the case. It has now been notified by NC JDSU because there is a history of blood donation and the clinical suspicion is high. It is not yet, however, a probable or confirme d case.

We have confirmed that the individual has donated blood in the las t 2 years, and a recall for in-date blood components (FFP was issu ed from two of these donations) was carried out. It is likely that these components were transfused some time ago, but we always ins titute the recall in case they remain in a freezer in a hospital b lood transfusion laboratory.

I understand that there have been several blood donations. There w ill almost inevitably be living recipients. We will start to trace the fate of the donations. However, I believe we should take no f urther action (advising clinicians to seek advice from the CIP) un til the case moves from "possible" to "probable". I will let you k now when this happens.
